



## LUXEMBOURG 100 CHALLENGE

Recent tragic events in Haiti have again demonstrated the relevancy and continued need for agencies like UNICEF, and that they continue to receive the funding needed to carry out their humanitarian work throughout the world.

To this end, Eurocontrol/Luxembourg employee Gregor Graham in association with EUROCONTROL and the Federation Luxembourgeoise de Golf, will be attempting the above challenge to raise funds for Unicef on the 29th June 2010.

There can be few, if any, countries in the world where such a challenge can be set to the worldwide golfing community. Every golf hole within one country in one day, that is both achievable but also a formidable test. In the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg that is 100 golf holes split over 6 different golf courses throughout the country.

Eurocontrol and UNICEF have just celebrated major milestones in their association with Luxembourg, Eurocontrol 40 years, and UNICEF 30 years in the Duchy, and it is fitting that this event is planned at this time. It is also hoped that the challenge will also raise awareness and promote the sport of golf, by association with the Federation Luxembourgeoise de Golf (FLG), both within and outside of Luxembourg, and to encourage golfers worldwide to accept this challenge in the future.

### **Rules of the challenge:**

- 100 holes to be completed within 1hr before official sunrise to 1hr after official sunset.
- Scores to be taken and cards to be marked by independent party and overseen by authority of FLG.
- Travel between courses by land only.
- Stableford rules apply i.e. player can lift ball and move to next hole only after there is no possibility of scoring points on that hole.

To establish a golfing target for future challengers, Gregor (handicap 8) will record a stableford score (see explanation below) for the 100 holes.

### **Stableford scoring:**

Points are allocated according to the net score against the par of the hole. In golf, par is a predetermined number of strokes that a scratch or "0" handicap golfer should require to complete a hole. The net score is the number of strokes taken at any hole, minus any stroke awarded at that hole due to the player's handicap.

	Number of strokes	Points
Bogey	= Par + 1 stroke	1
Par	= Par	2
Birdie	= Par – 1 stroke	3
Eagle	= Par – 2 strokes	4

Example: a player receiving 1 extra stroke due to their handicap at a hole designated as Par 5

Hole Par : 5 strokes

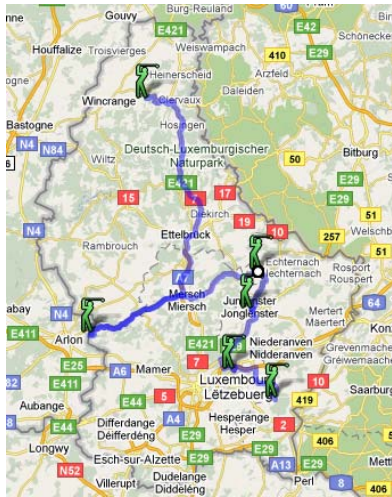
Player handicap: +1 additional stroke

If the player completes a hole in 6 strokes: the net score is  $6 - 1 = 5 = \text{Par}$  (of the hole) = 2 points

If the player completes a hole in 7 strokes: the net score is  $7 - 1 = 6 = \text{Bogey}$  = 1 point

It also means that if Gregor plays to his handicap throughout the challenge (highly unlikely) he should score a total of 200 points (100 holes \* 2 pts = 200 pts). In this case, if you sponsor 0.10€ per point, you should pay in total 20€ (0.10€ \* 200).
